

At the centre of the Swiss Museum of Agriculture is the new main exhibition "Who is Agriculture?" It focuses on the fault lines that run through current debates on agricultural policy in Switzerland, explores their historical dimensions and poses the question of what the future holds for agriculture in our country.

Spread over 1800 m² in ten distinctively themed spaces, with a collection of over one hundred exhibits and more than two hundred historical photographs by Ernst Brunner, the exhibition lays bare the burning issues: industrial food production, the use of pesticides and liquid manure, soil cultivation, biodiversity loss and species extinction, global competition between agricultural nations and, last but not least, us, the consumers who want to buy whatever we want in copious quantities from our supermarket and want it always to be aesthetically perfect, blemish-free and, above all, cheap.

In each thematic area, visitors will find take-home tips that will motivate them to do their bit for sustainable agriculture and food production. The exhibition is designed to provoke, educate, and stimulate debate, because one thing is beyond all doubt: Agriculture affects us all!
